ROM THE SUPERINTENDENT: The fourth quarter of school has started. Spring is in the air. The hope is we can get some rain. Springtime is a busy time of the year with track meets, music contests, and field trips.

The spring also is when the state test is given, now known as the Nebraska Student-Centered

Assessment System (NSCAS). The NSCAS is a test that the Nebraska Department of Education has contracted with Northwest Evaluation Association (the company associated with Measures of Academic Progress) to create. Just as in years past, the test will be taken by all students in grades 3-8. Students in grades 3-8 take an English Language Arts and Math test. Additionally, students in grades 5 and 8 take the science test. The window to take these tests are from April 1-May 10. The juniors took the ACT exam on March 21, 2023.

The plan is for the district results to be released to the media and published in the fall of 2023.

The state tests are summative assessments of a student's progress following a year of instruction. The NSCAS-ELA tests vocabulary, comprehension, and writing. The NSCAS-Math measures four concepts: number sense, geometric/measurement, algebraic, data analysis/probability. The NSCAS-Science measures student knowledge of physical science, earth science, and life science concepts, and inquiry skills.

Thank you teachers for all your work with our students. Good luck to our students as they begin NSCAS testing. *Mr. Kolin Haecker, Superintendent*

Every so often, a different reading suggestion is placed in front of students to help them grow in their knowledge and book choices. Thus far the challenges have been to read any book, to read a book about another culture, and read a book to learn something new. Each time, students get a different bookmark (which smells like a candy) and also a sweet treat if they complete the challenge.

We also have students in grades 3-6 who are voluntarily giving up their noon recess/access time to be part of a book "quiz bowl" called the Reading Rally. It is similar to Battle of the Books. Bruning-Davenport MS Robotics

We were fortunate enough this year to take **two** robotics teams to Beatrice to compete against other schools' teams in ESU #5. Our 8th grade team was made up of Kennedy B., Brodrick D., LeTrell H., and Cynthia O., while our 6th grade

team included Claire L., Mikey P.-L., Brayden P. and Rylan T. Between January and March 15th these students (along with Aliviah B., Adisynn K., Kyler K., Chase O., Josie S. and Adain S.) built their robots, learned to code them to do different tasks, designed their trailer hitch for a version of robot boat races, and designed 3-D printed parts to add to their battle bot configuration (like a smaller scale demo derby) in order to win medals and a trophy to take home.
