


### BOLTS: "Building Outstanding Leaders for Tomorrow's Society

**OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE REGULAR UNIFIED SCHOOL BOARD MEETING** - The Unified Board of Education met in Bruning on July 13, 2020. Pursuant to laws and notices posted in Bruning and Davenport, all proceedings were taken while convened meeting was open to the public. President Michael Schroeder called the meeting to order at 7:35 pm. Unified members present were Sarah Bolte, Jeff Hoins, and Jamie Koch. Local board members present were Sarah Krehnke, Ryan Miller, Sheri Norder, Ryne Philippi, and Brad Williams. Also present were Superintendent Kolin Haecker, Principal Damen Kugel, Sara Dierking, and Rick Ault.

President Schroeder recognized the Open Meeting Act.

Sarah Bolte made the motion to excuse the absences of Unified Board Members Jerry Baysinger, and Dan Domeier. The motion was seconded by Jamie Koch.

The Consent Agenda included the agenda, minutes of June 10, 2020 Unified meeting, Treasurer's Report, and July claims. Koch moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented and Jeff Hoins seconded the motion. Roll call vote carried 4-0.

Bruning-Davenport Unified School District's Financial Report was given by Superintendent Haecker.

Superintendent Haecker reported on the following items: The Mudecas volleyball tournament will now be played at four schools in the conference, budget work time will need to be scheduled in late August, a reopening plan that would be sent out to the parents, and he noted that Bruning-Davenport USD received our Certificate of Accreditation from the Department of Education. He also shared, Bright Arrow which is a communication tool, will be added to PowerSchool. He finalized his report by giving an update on the facility damage created by the storm.

### **Discussion Items**

Following discussion regarding the Daycare Contract no action was determined.

Superintendent Haecker shared a drafted reopening plan. The plan is a work in progress so no action was required.

A Classified Staff Salary schedule was shared with the board and no action taken.

Discussion was made about paying the classified staff if a possible closure becomes necessary. No action taken.

New Business (All motions require a roll call vote and all carried 4-0 unless noted.)

- A. No action was necessary for the hiring of a part-time Para (Paula Anderson) who took another position.
- B. Hoins moved to approve the resolution to establish Cornerstone Bank in Davenport and Bruning State Bank in Bruning as depository of funds for Bruning-Davenport USD. Seconded by Bolte.
- C. Koch moved to approve the resolution to establish Superintendent Kolin Haecker as agent for the District and may act on behalf of the district. Bolte seconded the motion.
- D. Hoins moved to approve the Inter-Local Agreement for Attendance Services with Jefferson County, seconded by Koch.
- E. Koch motioned to approve the Inter-Local Agreement with ESU for a ½ time Spanish Teacher at \$15,000.00, seconded by Bolte.

Motion made by Bolte to approve the Middle School and High School class schedules for 2020-2021 school year. The motion was seconded by Koch.

Schroeder adjourned the meeting at 8:12 pm
