Nebraska Education Profile The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) has released the Nebraska Education Profile. As you may recall, the profile replaced the State of the Schools Report that gave state, district, and school test data. You will find our assessment data for each of the groups on the NDE website (http://nep.education.ne.gov). Due to our numbers, though, much of the data is not available; however, I shared our data, by grade, in the November newsletter. The State released our new AQUESST (Accountability for a Quality Education System, Today and Tomorrow) classification rating. The AQUESTT classification combines performance on several indicators grouped by tenet to provide schools and districts with an overall descriptive classification of Excellent, Great, Good, or Needs Improvement. The tenets include Positive Partnerships, Relationships, and Success; Transitions, Educational Opportunities and Access; Teaching, Learning, and Serving; Assessment; and Educator Effectiveness.

Thank you! Bruning-Davenport USD wishes to thank all the businesses and agencies that supported our teams throughout the activity seasons by purchasing advertisements on the radio stations during their broadcasts. We are truly appreciative of your support of all the activities we participate in during the school year. Without your support, many of our patrons would miss out on the experience of hearing about our students.

Reminder With the beginning of the basketball season soon upon us, parents please keep your children with you on the bleachers during games. Please do not allow them on the balcony or outside unattended. Unsupervised children may get hurt or hurt someone else; no one wants that to happen. In addition parents, if you are not attending a game, please do not send your young child without supervision. The administration will send a child home that is unattended or is with someone younger than high school age. The school does not have sufficient personnel to supervise these children. Your cooperation is very much appreciated.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL: As the BDS volleyball team was competing for a championship on the court this past month, the BDS fans were also competing and being evaluated for *their* performance. Moments after our BDS volleyball team secured their spot as the 2019 D2 State Champs, the BDS fans were also awarded 2019 D2 Sportsmanship award. Beginning in 2010, the Nebraska Coaches Association has sponsored a sportsmanship award. They present this award to one school per class that displays the best sportsmanship throughout the state tournament.

During each game, judges move throughout the crowd and evaluate fans based on a very specific and structured system that is used to determine the recipient of the sportsmanship award. The judges split up throughout the game and observe from different areas of the crowd and fan section. They award points to schools for positive behaviors such as positive signs, chants/cheers, dress up themes, enthusiasm towards opponents, school pep bands, visible mascots, and adequate administrative supervision.

Additionally, the judges deduct points for negative reactions towards opponents and officials, inappropriate signs or actions, unsportsmanlike conduct by a player or coach, and lack of administrative supervision. The points for each match are then averaged and the school with the highest average for the tournament is then awarded the sportsmanship award.

It is so rewarding to know that with our strong athletics program, also comes a strong fan base. I appreciate all who came to support our students this Fall in a positive and uplifting way. I also value that not only can I see this strength in our school spirit, but that it is also being recognized on a more formal level. I'm excited to note that since the creation of this award in 2010, the BDS coop has won the award three times. This speaks to our athletes, coaches, administration, and fans. Thank you to all who are a constant part of our B-D and BDS families.

OUNSELOR CORNER....What to expect after you submit your FAFSA The <u>FAFSA</u> opened October 1, so many of you have already completed and submitted your form. Here's what happens next:

Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR). You'll receive it via an email link if you provided an email address on your FAFSA. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action to process your FAFSA.

Make sure you applied for admission to colleges you listed on your FAFSA. Colleges that receive your FAFSA results typically won't send you a financial aid package until you've applied and have been accepted to the school.

Watch for verification requests. The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA might request verification of your FAFSA information. If so, send the required documents to the colleges' financial aid office.

Watch for financial aid award notifications. The colleges you were accepted to – and listed on your FAFSA – will send your financial aid award notifications detailing the types and amounts of aid they're offering based on your financial needs.

Haven't completed your FAFSA yet? No problem! You and a parent can complete the form at <u>FAFSA.gov</u>. Before you start, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>. You'll need them to access and sign the form. Winning the scholarship game: Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

Don't ever pay for scholarship searches! Use *free* resources such as <u>ScholarshipQuest</u> at EducationQuest.org with over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships, or free national sites like <u>Cappex</u>, <u>GoodCall</u>, and <u>Chegg</u>.

Visit your school counselor often for information about local scholarships.

Focus on local and college-specific scholarships because you're more likely to earn them.

Update your activities, honors, community service or paid jobs using the <u>Activities Resume</u> at EducationQuest.org, see examples from Miss Hoffman, or any other Resume Temples.

Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exam(s) in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.

Use quality references such as a teacher, coach, or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them a specific deadline, and a copy of your Activities Resume.

Tailor your essay to the scholarship. Ask an English teacher to read your essay and offer advice on making a big impact. Your essay will need to stand out from other applications.
