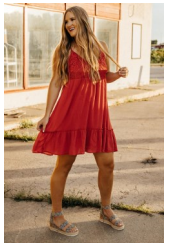

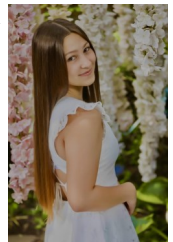

**SCHOLARSHIP: SUSAN T. BUFFETT FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP.** Buffett Scholarship opens on November 1. The deadline is February 1. This scholarship is one of the best scholarships Nebraska has to offer. You do need to complete your FAFSA for this. For more information, please visit <https://buffettscholarships.org/eligibility-selection>.

You submitted your FAFSA - - - NOW WHAT?

**Expect a Student Aid Report via email.** It acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and tells you if you need to take further action.

**Make sure you applied to colleges you listed on your FAFSA.** Colleges that receive your FAFSA results typically won't send you a financial aid package until you have applied and been accepted to the school.

**Watch for verification requests.** The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA might request verification of your FAFSA information. If so, send the required documents to the colleges' financial aid office.

**Watch for financial aid award notifications.** The colleges you applied to – and listed on your FAFSA – will send you a financial aid award notification detailing the types and amounts of aid they're offering based on your financial need.

**Update Your Activities Resume** You'll need updated information for scholarship applications. **These are very useful when applying for scholarships and asking for letters of recommendation.** Instead of writing everything out, you can print "see attached resume" and give your recommenders a copy.

**Get Serious About Applying for Scholarships.** See ScholarshipQuest for Nebraska-based scholarships and a list of national search sites. Miss Hoffman shared a google folder to seniors and senior parents with college events and scholarships available. You also can find scholarship information on the bulletin board in the student lounge, and on the school website ([bruningdavenport.org](http://bruningdavenport.org)).

**WINTER BREAK = TIME TO SEARCH FOR SCHOLARSHIPS**

Winter break is an excellent time for seniors to search for scholarships, and we can help! [ScholarshipQuest](http://ScholarshipQuest) is a *FREE* database accessible through our website that contains application information for more than 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships.

**Request Letters of Recommendations for Scholarship Applications.** Ask adults who know you well, Give them plenty of notice, a deadline, details about the scholarship, and a copy of your Activities Resume.

If you haven't already, you will want to start creating your **HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES RESUMES.** EducationQuest.org and Nebraska Career Connections have great templates, along with Microsoft Word/Google Docs. **These are very useful when applying for scholarships.** Instead of writing everything out, you can print "see attached resume." These are useful for recommenders to use also.

## **JUNIORS... tasks for this Winter!**

**College Courses.** Juniors don't forget to purchase your college textbook for your college courses if you are taking classes from UNL. If you have questions or need help finding your textbooks online please let Miss Hoffman know.

**Take the ACT.** Colleges use your best score for college admissions and scholarship consideration. Juniors will be taking the **Nebraska State ACT on Tuesday, March 21, 2023.** There are various other **National Test Dates** are located in your student handbook, online school calendar, the bulletin board in the lounge, your locker, and [act.org](http://act.org). Bruning-Davenport High School is utilizing **ON TO COLLEGE: JOHN BAYLOR** test prep. Each student has an account and already has their username and password. Juniors will be using ACT Prep, ACT Refresher Prep, PSAT Quick Power Prep, and Study Skills & Test Taking Strategies. Fee waivers are available. You can take the ACT as many times as you wish. Colleges will use your best score for admission and scholarship decisions.

**Set up a ScholarshipQuest profile.** You'll be matched with Nebraska-based scholarships that match your criteria. Watch for the EducationQuest Scavenger Hunt Scholarship.

**Update or Create an Activities Resume** if you haven't done so yet. Nebraska Career Connections and EducationQuest have templates, along with Microsoft Word/Google Docs. **These are very useful when applying for scholarships and asking for letters of recommendation.** Instead of writing everything out, you can print "see attached resume" and give your recommenders a copy. The sooner you create a resume, the less you will have to remember your senior year. If you need any help or want to look at examples, Miss Hoffman is available and has previous years' resumes.

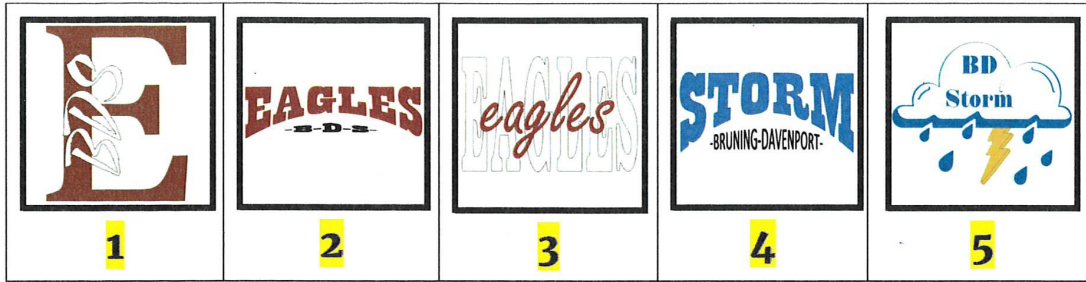

**OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE REGULAR UNIFIED SCHOOL BOARD MEETING** – The Unified Board of Education met in Davenport on December 12, 2022. Pursuant to laws and notices posted at Bruning-Davenport Schools, Cornerstone Bank, Bruning Bank, Bruning Post Office, Davenport Post Office, and also published in The Hebron Journal Register on December 7, 2022; all proceedings were taken while meeting was open to the public. President Schroeder called the meeting to order at 8:02 pm. Unified members present were Jerry Baysinger, Jamie Koch, Sarah Krehnke, and Sheri Norder. Local board members present were, Dan Domeier, Pat Kowalski, Ryan Miller, and Brad Williams. Also present were Superintendent Kolin Haecker, Principal Damen Kugel, and Sara Dierking. Staff members present were Rick Ault, Beth Ardissono, Jill Catlett, Angela Brase, Britany Renz, Jill Rohr, Lichelle Houchin, Beth Dolnicek, Cathy Hergott, Cammie Freitag, and Ruth Kowalski. Students present to observe were Jessa Lynn Hudson, Malory Dickson, Samantha Enghauser, Hallie Hoins, Zach and Cameron Hoins.

Sarah Krehnke moved to excuse the absence of Unified Board Member Jeff Hoins, seconded by Jamie Koch.

President Schroeder welcomed all guests and recognized the Open Meetings Act – Jill Catlett spoke at public forum.

President Schroeder ask for a motion to approve The Consent Agenda which included the agenda, minutes of November 14, 2022 Unified Board meeting, Treasurer’s Report, and the December claims. Koch moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented, seconded by Sheri Norder. Roll call vote (5-0)

Principal Kugel reported on the following items – 1<sup>st</sup> semester observations and evaluations have been completed – Jill Rohr, Melinda Kerwood and Daniel Boshart are on schedule to earn tenure this spring – Mr. Baires, Mrs. Hulse, Principal Kugel and wife LaRaesha attended the Nebraska Music Education Association banquet which Principal Kugel was awarded the Outstanding Administrator of 2022 – Schedule for 2023-2024 school year is in the early stages of being created and several new classes to be added – he attended the NCSA principals conference and finalized his report with upcoming events.

Superintendent Haecker presented to President Michael Schroeder a plaque for his 24 years of service on the school board.

Superintendent Haecker’s report consisted of –NSCAS test scores – Davenport doors should arrive and be installed during the Christmas break – BDS Coop meeting – SENCAP equipment to get updated to teach SENCAP classes – Teacher Appreciation Dinner survey – he attended the Legislature Conference – out of 244 school districts in Nebraska only 86 receive any state aid and the Legislature is looking at reforming the TEEOSA formula for school funding – he finalized his report with the monthly financials.

- B. Staff Appreciation Dinner – consensus was to proceed with the dinner and book a venue.
- C. Public Forum – Discussion was made and consideration will be given to all concerns.

**New Business:** (All motions require a roll call vote and all carried 5-0 unless noted.)

- A. Motion was made by Koch to congratulate One Act members and coaches (Shannon Collier and Kenny Baires) on their season. Seconded by Krehnke.
- B. Jerry Baysinger moved to approve, with regrets, the resignation of Shawna Garland (Business Teacher) at the end of school year 2022-2023. Motion was seconded by Norder.
- C. Koch motioned to approve the Early Separation Stipend for Shawna Garland, seconded by Krehnke.
- D. Motion for approval of the Audit Financial Statement prepared by the auditor for the year ending August 31, 2022 was made by Krehnke, seconded by Baysinger.
- E. Krehnke motioned to approve the sale of a wrestling mat for the amount of \$500.00 to Crofton Public school, seconded by Norder.

President Schroeder adjourned the meeting at 9:02 pm
