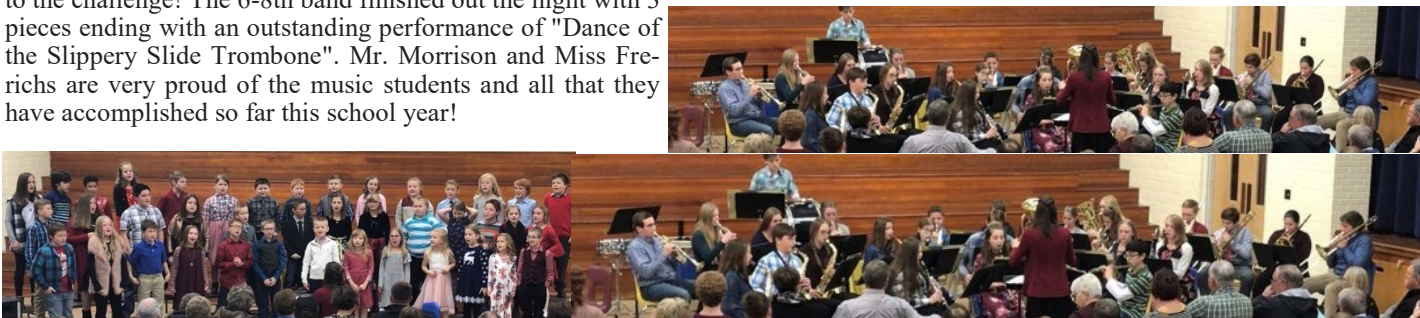

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE REGULAR UNIFIED SCHOOL BOARD MEETING - The Unified Board of Education met in Davenport on December 9, 2019. Pursuant to laws and notices posted in Bruning and Davenport, all proceedings were taken while convened meeting was open to the public. President Michael Schroeder called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Unified members present were Dan Domeier, Jeff Hoins, Jamie Koch, and Sarah Krehnke. Local board members present were Sarah Bolte, Ryan Miller, Sheri Norder, Ryne Philippi (7:36 pm), Rod Tegtmeier and Brad Williams. Also present were Superintendent Kolin Haecker, Principal Damen Kugel, Sara Dierking, Lichelle Houchin, and Alicia Hoffman.

Dan Domeier made the motion to excuse the absence of Unified Board Member Jerry Baysinger, seconded by Sarah Krehnke.

President Schroeder recognized the Open Meeting Act. The Consent Agenda included the agenda, minutes of November 11, 2019 Unified Board meeting, Treasurer's Report, and the December claims. Jamie Koch moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented and Krehnke seconded the motion. Roll call vote carried 5-0.

Principal Kugel presented the principal's report: Teacher observations/evaluations, Grandparents' Day, One Act competition at CRC and District earning 5th Place at both. He also mentioned Dibels Testing, NSCAS/Map Testing, and the Principals Conference that he will be attending. Other shared information was upcoming events.

Superintendent Haecker reported on the following items: The comparability study for negotiations he had shared with the Board and Teacher Negotiation Committee, and the coach bus door that had come open over the weekend. He also mentioned the upcoming board re-election process and dates, and mentioned the recent meeting on the daycare. He finalized his report regarding an action item.

Discussion item

- A. Discussion item was for the district paying for Grandparents' day.
- B. Following discussion regarding adding Golf to the BDS Coop, Jeff Hoins made a motion to approve, seconded by Domeier. Motion passed 4-1 (yes: Domeier, Hoins, Koch, Krehnke, no: Schroeder).

New Business (All motions require a roll call vote and all carried 5-0 unless noted.)

- A. Domeier made the motion, seconded by Koch, to approve the 2019 audit.
- B. Krehnke moved to congratulate and recognize the Play Production members and coaches David Morrison, and Megan Frerichs for the season. Hoins seconded the motion.
- C. Hoins made the motion, seconded by Koch, to accept and approve Fred Kluck's and Pat Remmers' applications for the early separation stipend.
- D. Domeier moved to accept the resignations of Fred Kluck (Social Sciences/Social Studies), Douglas Otto (Elementary, MS, & Freshman PE), and Patricia Remmers (Kindergarten) at the end of the 2019-2020 school year. The motion was seconded by Koch.

Executive Session

Koch moved to enter executive session "to prevent needless injury to the reputation of an individual" at 8:12 pm to evaluate the superintendent. Hoins seconded the motion.

Domeier moved to end the executive session and to resume the regular session at 8:25 pm. Seconded by Koch.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:26 pm by President Schroeder.
