Child Find is a component of <u>Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)</u> that requires states to identify, locate, and evaluate all children with disabilities, aged birth to 21, who are in need of early intervention or special education services. If you have concerns regarding your child's development, please come to the meeting where we can provide you with contact information for support in speech therapy, occupational therapy, and physical therapy.

Bruning-Davenport USD has much to offer students. The District offers a strong academic program that includes access to dual-credit courses from the University of Nebraska Now program, Southeast Community College, and Peru State College. This has been utilized by a number of students to earn college credits at vastly reduced tuition fees and the possibility to enter college as a second semester freshman. In addition we are a member of a career academy, in partnership with Southeast Community College, offering students dual credit courses in areas of education, health services, technology, and agriculture. We are in the process of updating our shop area at the Bruning building to offer SENCAP welding for college credit starting in the fall of 2023.

As for extracurriculars we offer a strong fine arts program, FCCLA and FFA programs, and quality athletic programs. FROM THE PRINCIPAL: In January, the Bruning-Davenport Steering Committee, composed of district teachers and administrators, set up an online Google Survey to gauge our district's climate and culture. Participants were asked about our district's strengths, how information is relayed, and also what could be done differently. Our continuous goal is to help improve our engagement and community outreach. The survey was distributed using our district's BrightArrow communication system. The survey was distributed via text, and email to families, as well as posted on the school website, and our BD USD Facebook page.

In total, there were 61 parent surveys completed, 35 staff surveys completed, and 93 student surveys completed. More than 95% of the respondents rated our district positively in terms of communication within the community, noting that BD USD excels at providing information in a timely manner through multiple channels; including automated calls and emails. The areas for improvement focused on the need for even more information and updates. As a district, we utilize Facebook, Twitter, Daily/Weekly Bulletins, our all-call system - BrightArrow, a monthly newsletter, our district master calendar, and our school website.

It is my personal belief that as a district, we have made tremendous strides in communication over the last several years. In recent years, Bruning-Davenport has adopted an all-call system called BrightArrow. The system communicates with Powerschool to send notifications to parents regarding school events, meetings, and cancellations. Additionally, our monthly newsletter is a way to communicate current events, showcase student achievements, and highlight our talented staff who are making a difference every day. Our Bruning-Davenport Facebook page is updated with the most up-to-date information. Our district website has dramatically increased traffic since its relaunch in 2020. The content, quality, and frequency of all of our platforms and social outlets have significantly improved.

In the survey, respondents noted they are most happy with the staff, teachers, and district and how we strive to put our students first. These surveys will continue to be analyzed by the Steering Committee Meeting, and the Bruning-Davenport board of education, and relayed to our stakeholders to provide feedback and clarity.

Thank you to all the survey participants who took the time to provide their feedback. In the year ahead, we look forward to continuing to improve and further advancing how we reach out to and support the Bruning-Davenport community. DEREK DOMEIER is the son of Daniel and Andi Domeier. His siblings are Dylan and Peyton. Derek is involved in Football,


