ROM THE SUPERINTENDENT: We are about six weeks through the school year. Its been a reasonably smooth transition considering all the new faces and life events.

Our new nurse is Lacey Wagner. She will be in the building 2 days week. That includes some time at Shickley.

The 23-24 school budget was submitted this morning. The tax rate will be .479 (pennies) mill levy rate. Last year it was 50 but property valuations went up considerably this past year.

Board talking points and upcoming projects: Card key entrance capability and a school wide camera system. This would be paid for with building funds. The Bruning Building Fund has \$410,000 and the Davenport Building Fund has \$440,000. We may be able to also use ESSER (covid) money and possible grants.

New vehicles, including a bus, 1-2 vans/suburbans, 1-2 cars and a possible pickup truck. This would be funded out of the Depreciation Account, which currently has \$750,000. We also need some HVAC work done in Bruning and weight room updates (building funds). The Activity Fund accounts have (Bruning \$254,000 and Davenport \$140,000.)
